

## SHARE Code of Conduct

Regarding parents: Parents are allowed on dance premises to take pictures up to 7pm. After that, all parents must not be on dance premises until 15 minutes before the dance ends (10:15 for homecoming, 10:45 for prom). Parents are not allowed in the outdoor seating area or lobby areas. Waiting in cars is acceptable, but the 15-minute rule still applies. Only chaperones are allowed to stay the entire evening.

Regarding students: Any student caught taking inappropriate pictures will be asked to delete the pictures immediately and leave the dance for the entirety of the dance and will not be refunded. Throwing drinks on the dance floor is prohibited as well as large groups in the bathrooms. Any physical rough housing is prohibited, and students may be asked to leave the dance and will not be refunded. This is at the discretion of the dance committee.

**\*\*New\*\*** We are not taking song requests at registration or on the night of the dance. We have a wonderful Christian DJ who understands SHARES values as well as what is popular with today's teens. Please inform your teenager that they are not allowed to make song requests of the DJ.

## SHARE Dress Code Policy

SHARE dances are an event which reflect the philosophy of our learning center, Homelink, and adhere to Christian teachings regarding modesty. As stated in the Homelink Handbook.

“We do not want to stifle anyone’s sense of style or limit their comfort but are trying to help students make good decisions about their appearance. . . C.S. Lewis on modesty: ‘A real desire to believe all the good you can of others and to make others as comfortable as you can, will solve most of the problems.’”

Dress code regulations must be followed by all students attending. **Guidelines will be strictly enforced. Decisions regarding attire are entirely at the discretion of the dance coordinators.** All students, including guests, who are not in compliance with the dress code will not be admitted to dances and refunds will not be issued. We welcome all homeschool students and strive to create a fun atmosphere, however if you are not willing to comply with the dress code policy we ask that you not attend.

### MODIFICATIONS

- There will NOT be any loaner clothing options available.
- Any modifications to an outfit must be secure. We recommend sewing, not pinning if possible.

- Whatever modification is made to an outfit, it must stay in place for the entire dance.
- No cover-ups (coats, shawls, sweaters) will be allowed to cover clothing items that do not meet dress code. You may wear something underneath.
- Clothing must fit appropriately. If an outfit needs to be modified, please do so before attending the dance. There are many SHARE members who sew!

NEW for All: There are to be NO backpacks or large purses. A small crossbody purse is acceptable for girls. No outside drinks are allowed, including water bottles. No baseball caps, but cowboy hats or fedoras are ok. No face masks that cover the entire face or head. No costumes.

### Girls

- Strapless dresses and spaghetti straps are allowed provided they follow the dress code. •  
Pantsuits/jumpsuits are allowed if they are formal in style. No denim.
- Hemlines, slits for dresses, shorts or any part of your outfit must be no shorter than four inches above the top of the knee while standing straight. This applies to the outfit on the sides and back as well. **Please be aware of how the outfit fits you personally.** The same dress on one girl may be entirely different on another girl.
- Strive for minimal to no cleavage. Dresses may not be cut below the bust line (see photo). Lace or see-through material in the cleavage area does not count as coverage.



Bust line

- Dresses may be backless as long as they are not cut below the naval. To test, wrap a piece of string around your waist and see if your dress is lower than the string.
- No midriffs may be exposed in the front or sides. Lace or see-through material does not count

as coverage. Two-piece dresses must overlap at the waist and stay that way all evening. Meaning the top must overlap with the skirt waistband.

- No side exposure. The dress may not be cut out on the sides. With arms down at your side, if flesh touches flesh, the dress is inappropriate. Lace or see-through material does not count as coverage.
- Undergarments should not be visible.
- Tennis shoes are allowed.

No face masks covering the entirety of the face or costumes.

### Boys

- Formal attire is classified as a tuxedo or dress suit including a tie or bow tie, a dress shirt, and may include a vest or cummerbund. Jacket recommended but not required. **Jackets must be removed in the line to come into the dance.**
- For semi-formal attire dress pants or docker type slacks are acceptable with a dress shirt. Tie recommended but not required.
- Shirts are to be worn at all times.
- Shirts need to remain buttoned.
- No sleeveless shirts. You may not wear a sleeveless shirt and cover it with a jacket.

**No denim jeans or flannel shirts.** Tennis shoes are allowed.
